## How can I spread the word?

## How do I raise money?

It's best to publicise your event well ahead of time. Getting in touch with your local newspaper, radio station or 'what's on' guide is a great way to boost publicity, especially if you can supply a photo. Putting up posters about your fundraising event on notice boards in your local community can also help raise the profile of your event.

You're welcome to use our name and logo – please do give us a call to ask about this. We also have template posters for you to fill in with your own event details.

Remember you can use social media to let everyone know about what you're doing. You can share your online fundraising page if you have one, and post messages each week to let people know how your preparations are going. Share your photos and, if you tag @MacularSociety and @TeamMacular, we will share them too! We're on Facebook, Twitter and Instagram.



Whether you're fundraising on your own or with friends and family, or as part of a club or workplace, we're so grateful for your support. You're making it possible for more research to be funded to find a cure for macular disease, and keeping our support services running for every person who needs them. When you fundraise for the Macular Society, you're Beating Macular Disease for everyone. Thank you so much.

Setting up an online fundraising page is quite straightforward, and you'll be amazed at how supportive and generous people can be. Using a platform such as justgiving.com/macularsociety, you can send the link to your online giving page to family, friends and colleagues. They can donate on your fundraising page, and the money raised will be recorded and sent directly to us without you having to collect it yourself. You can add photos and updates, and let people know why you're supporting people with macular disease.

Top tip: see if your company will match-fund your donation. It's an easy way to double your fundraising!

## The legal bits

Whether you decide to collect cash, sell goods, or sell tickets, please read through the following when planning your event:

It's your responsibility to make sure that your event is safe and legal. But don't let the red tape put you off! We recommend making a list and ticking off the tasks as you go. Here are a few things to consider:

### **Insurance**

Unless you are one of our Macular Society Support Groups, the Macular Society cannot accept liability for any loss, damage or injury suffered by you, or anyone else, as a result of your fundraising activity. You may need to check that you have sufficient insurance. This may be covered by the venue, or your own personal insurance if the event is in your home, but you should check well in advance.

## Health and safety

Make sure that safety precautions are taken and think about whether you need a first aid kit

on site. Visit **hse.gov.uk** for more information. If you're organising a large event, please contact your local St John Ambulance for advice. It may be helpful for you to complete a risk assessment before organising your event – we can send you a sample form to get you started.

#### Licences

If you're holding a collection in a public place you will need to obtain permission from your local authority, and a collection in a supermarket will require the store manager's permission. All collectors must be over the age of 16. You will also need to obtain permission from your local authority if planning to sell alcohol or have entertainment (if your venue does not already have a licence).

### Food and drink

If you plan to have food and drink at your event, you must make sure that food is prepared safely. Check food.gov.uk for information. Be sure to specify your food's ingredients because many people have allergies.

## How to pay in your money

### Raffles

A simple raffle (for example using cloakroom tickets where tickets are sold and drawn on the same day) does not need a licence. However, if you're selling tickets in advance (for example with specially printed tickets) then please check the regulations governing this at gamblingcommission.gov.uk.

## **Data protection**

We all need to comply with the Data Protection Act 2018 (see gov. uk/data-protection). Everyone responsible for using personal data must follow strict rules called 'data protection principles'. They must make sure the information is: used fairly, lawfully and transparently. Examples of this are that it is unlawful to store details of individuals for longer than necessary, or to pass on details to third parties. Also, any individual's details must be kept secure and private.

Thank you for fundraising to Beat Macular Disease. We kindly ask that you pay in all your fundraised money to us within four weeks of your event. Here are some ways you can do it:
